Those of you who were lucky enough to attend the History of the Library program presented by Village historian Dana White and town historian Scott Craven can vouch for that-and I've noticed a common thread in the letters, reports, and papers prepared by the library directors who came before me: a profound gratitude for the Ossining community. For decades, Ossining residents have shown their support for the library by attending library programs, voting for library budgets, and advocating for library services in times where state and local budgets were lean. Our programs were tremendously well attended before regular library programming became the norm and increased visits to the library at the turn of the 20th century led the Board of Trustees to move the library multiple times to best serve our patrons. The unwavering support you've given us over the past 125 years is truly marvelous and as we approach Thanksgiving, I think it's only right to thank you sincerely, on behalf of the library staff, for your continued patronage.
