From the Director's Desk

What do Harry Potter, Captain Underpants, the Bible, **To Kill a Mockingbird**, and **The Hate U Give** have in common? They are among the books most frequently challenged, with numerous people across the country trying to have them removed from library shelves.

While it seems shocking that book banning is a possibility in 2018, the numbers don't lie: according to the American Library Association's Office of Intellectual Freedom, there were 354 challenges to public, school, or academic library materials last year, with 416 books being subject to complaints about their language or content. Even classics aren't safe; Of Mice and Men, regarded as an essential part of the literary canon, was called "a worthless, profanity-riddled novel" by a parent in Kansas whose child was assigned the book in school.

I firmly believe, as the ALA Bill of Rights states, that libraries should be environments free of censorship and that the materials on our shelves will be protected from complaints about their content. This is why I look forward, every September, to Banned Books Week, which celebrates our freedom to read every book of our choosing. This month, Banned Books Week falls from September 23rd to 29th, and our adult, children's, and teen services librarians have been hard at work on displays in honor. I encourage you to stop by and learn more about the books that are often challenged and why—and maybe even take one home.



Parent Connections








