I, and the rest of the Ossining Public Library community, was saddened to hear about the passing of Sawsan Nosseir, who worked at the library for many years. Her library career began at OPL when she was hired as a part-time library assistant while she worked on her undergraduate degree at Pace University. She soon became the library's Head of Circulation and many of the pages she supervised remembered fondly when she would time how long it took to shelve a book truck. Her

circulation work inspired her to enroll in Columbia University's School of Library and Information Science, where she studied part-time and eventually earned her Master's Degree in June of 1973. Her time at the Ossining Library saw her duties and responsibilities expand considerably, becoming Head of Adult Services and eventually being promoted to Assistant Director. She also worked for several years at the Pace University Law Library. Hers was an extraordinary library career and former coworkers, colleagues, and patrons have reached out to share stories about her; I know she is missed by the library staff and the Ossining community. On behalf of the staff and Board of Trustees, we thank her for her library service and send the best wishes to her children.
