Why is this bond necessary?	We need to invest in maintaining an updated and healthy building to best serve our community with space to gather, attend programming, and access the many resources the library offers. Isn't this building new?	It's not as new as it seems – construction on the library building began 20 years ago.	After all these years of serving the community, the building needs many essential repairs (ex. the HVAC system, roof, and retaining wall). We've made some necessary improvements in the last few years but more intensive/extensive work is required.
